Earth Day, celebrated on April 22 every year, is a reminder of our shared responsibility towards a healthy planet and a call to action for individuals, organizations, and governments alike

Plastic consists of fossil fuels and releases carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gas emissions. A recent release of the UN Environment Program (UNEP) stated that every day, equivalent to 2,000 garbage trucks full of plastics are dumped into the oceans, rivers, lakes and other natural water reservoirs — around 19-20 million tonnes of plastics and its molecules are leaked into waterbodies.

Plastic harms our priceless marine resources. Don't throw plastic and ensure clean sea beaches & river banks

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Plastic straws; Disposable cutlery like spoons, forks, plates and cups; Polythene carry bags; Food packaging like wrappers of chips and chocolates, milk pouches are Single-use plastic products

They are used only once and then discarded. We rely on them for being cheap, light weight, safe and convenient for food transport and storage...

...these single use plastic products when dumped on roads, railway tracks and water bodies, also enter the drainage system. This causes the drains to clog, resulting in water logging, a major problem, especially during monsoons.

Therefore, each one of us has a role to play in restricting plastic pollution...

- **Refuse** say no to plastic, particularly single use plastic as much as possible
- Reduce- limit or reduce the use of plastic in daily life
- Reuse- reuse plastic products as much as possible, before disposing them
- **Recycle** Plastic products should be recycled into other usable products. This reduces the demand for raw plastic required to make various plastic products
